

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, ss:

Personally came before me, a Charles Seymour, in and for aforesaid County and State, aged 50 years and Robert Syle, aged 28 years citizens of the town of 405 N. Dallas St., Baltimore, State of Maryland.

well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case, as follows:

That we are near neighbors and intimate friends of the claimant Noah Jackson, and that we are in condition to know and do know by our frequent visits to the house and frequent intercourse; that the claimant Noah Jackson is in a very precarious condition of health, that he has been confined to his room for over two four months, utterly helpless needing constant care and attention, that he is suffering from Rheumatism which has resulted in heart trouble and that he may die at any moment. We also certify that the claimant is in very necessitous circumstances, entirely dependent upon the charity of neighbors and friends.

We know the above facts from our frequent visits to the house and our own personal knowledge and intimate acquaintance of many years

We further declare that we have no interest in said case, and are not concerned in its prosecution.
