Private John Chase of Captain Pennington's  
Company, (A) of the Fourth Regiment of the United States  
Colored Troops was enlisted by Col. Wm. Birney of  
the Fourth Regiment of Baltimore, Md.  
on the fifteenth day of July, 1863, to serve three years; he was born  
in Prince George Co in the State of Maryland, is twenty nine  
years of age, five feet six inches high, black complexion, black eyes,  
black hair, and by occupation when enlisted a Laborer. During the last two  
months said soldier has been unfit for duty days.  
Soldier states that his disease was caused by cold & exposure  
It is well when initiated -
