of one eye witness.

Clara and Elsie Wright are guilty  
of perjury in testifying before Special  
Examiner M. Cutler to continuous  
cohabitation, when they both testify  
before me that at the time of testifying  
before Spcl Exr Cutler they knew they  
were testifying falsely, as Clara had  
not lived with Soldier for four or  
five years previous to his death.

I could find no evidence tending to  
show prior marriage of either party,  
nor do the Court records show that  
any divorce proceedings were instituted  
by either.

While there is no evidence of Clara having  
remarried I think there is sufficient  
evidence in addition to her own ad-  
missions that she has violated the  
Act of August 7, 1882.

I have been unable to find any  
of Soldier's employers. Robinson  
the brickmaker has long since been  
out of business and could afford  
me no information, nor could  
I obtain any information among  
the Dyestockers concerning Soldier.
