

testimony is herewith attached but which I think refutes soldier's allegations as to him having contracted chronic diarrhoea or kidney disease in service nor does it appear that the disease of which he died was in any wise due to his Army service. His fatal illness as shown by the testimony of Dr Gosweller and death certificate was phthisis, which was undoubtedly the immediate cause of death, which Dr G. testifies was superinduced by bright disease of comparatively recent origin.

While I believe that Clint and Soldier were lawfully married as alleged by Rev. Dr. Fry ^{who deceased in 1882}, I could obtain no record evidence of same, there having been no return made of same, nor has the minister's son any of his father's marriage records, if he kept any which the son doubts, and to be satisfied, he made a careful search among his father's effects, but failed to find any trace of marriage records. - The only evidence of marriage is the prenuptial evidence,
