He was for 6 weeks confined to his bed before he died and we used to have to go to the dispensary to get medicine for his cough.

Now I have proof that Deane lived about the last 4 years of his life at 517 St. George St. in the house owned by Mrs. Adams and that you were not living with him during that time. I've you been advised from him or he from you. No sir. Well I thought it was 707. Yes it is right next to a church.

Who did you live with during the four years you were separated from Deane.
