I live at 1403 Farmwood Ave. Baltimore Md
 I am the wife of Edward Smith. I live on Green Willow St. East - Fall.
 I have known this claimant here present - Alice Duncan - ever since we were children together in the West End of Baltimore on Beaumont Alley. My ^{young sister} sister married her brother Robert Stewart. Her name was Alice Stewart. till she married John Duncan. I know her all the time and she never was married to any one till she was married to John Duncan. I and my husband were present at her marriage in 1880 or 1881. - Since 1880 on Broadway the city at the residence of Mr. Fry, a white Presby. Clergy Minister. My husband and I went with her and John Duncan to this minister and were the only witnesses to the marriage. The minister lived at Cor 7 Broadway and Fayette St.. He is dead. but his son is an undertaker at Cor of Mulliken and Broadway. After his marriage Alice and John lived together on Mulliken St. near Caroline about 4 or 5 years.
