DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

personally appeared before me,

Alice Duncan within and for the county and State

aforsaid, aged 38 years, a resident of the City of Baltimore, county of

State of Maryland who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of John Duncan who enlisted under the name of John Duncan

at Baltimore, on the 19 day of July A. D. 1863, in Co. I 19 U.S.C. Art.

and served at least ninety days in the war of the rebellion; who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED, and died March 20 1893

That she was married under the name of Alice Stewart, to said John Duncan, on the 8 day of April 1880, by Rev. Mr. Fry, at Baltimore,

there being no legal barrier to said marriage. That she has not remarried since the death of the said John Duncan

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor. That names and dates of birth of all the children now living under sixteen years of age of the soldier are as follows:

That she has heretofore applied for a pension and the number of her former application is
