Madam:

In response to your letter relative to your above-cited claim for pension, you are advised that it requires, in addition to the evidence indicated in the inclosed circular letter, your statement giving your full and correct name, as your name appears as Annie and Annie R. in the case, and you should sign said statement as you would have your name appear in your pension certificate should pension be allowed.

Your affidavit or that of some other person having the requisite knowledge is required showing why the soldier's name appears in the certified copy of the death record on file as Harry Greene, since he was pensioned under the name of Henry T. Green and was married under that name.

The fact and date of death of each of the two deceased wives of the soldier should be shown by a certified copy of the public, church or cemetery record, if such record exists; or, if not, by the sworn statement of two credible witnesses having personal knowledge of the facts to which they testify who should state how they are able to fix the date or approximate date of death of each.

The sworn testimony of two credible witnesses having the requisite knowledge is also required showing whether the soldier was married more than three times prior to his marriage to you, and, if, so, to whom and how same terminated.
