SIR:

Your inquiry of *Nov 24th*, 1882, in Pension Claim No. *419,524*, is

herewith returned, with the following information:

Henry T. Green was enrolled on the *15th* day of *July*, 1863, at *Baltimore, Md*, as a *Sergeant* in Co. *A*, *4th* Regiment of U. S. Colored *Troops*, to serve *3* years.

He is reported on Muster Roll *s* from origin, to *April 30/64 present for duty*; *April 30th to Aug 31st "Wounded in battle at Spring Hill, May '64. Absent in Genl. Hosp."*; *Sept & Oct. present for duty*; *Nov & Dec. "absent sick"*; *Dec 31/64 to Feby 28/66, present for duty.* He was mustered out of service with *hon.* *May 4/66, at Washington, D.C. as 1st Sergeant.*

Regtl. description book shows him wounded in the left arm in action at Spring Hill, Va, *May - '64.* Company morning report shows him *Dec 13/65, sent to hospital; Dec 29/65, returned from hospital. Jan 29/66 on 10 days leave; Feby 9/66, returned to duty; Feby 18/66, on the sick list; Mar 4/66 from present sick to duty.*

The records of this office do not show nature of wound, or cause of furlough.
