Wound of left arm and rheumatism, disease of kidneys and back, diarrhoea, hemorrhage of lungs, disease of eyes and general debility, disease of heart, injury of left ankle, asthma

He receives a pension of 8 dollars per month.

Here give the claimant's statement (as briefly and as compactly as possible) in regard to the date of origin and cause of his disabilities and the manner in which they affect him.

He makes the following statement in regard to the origin of his disabilities and date when first discovered by him: G.S.W. left arm at Spring Hill, Va. in 1864-rheumatism and injury to left ankle since service due to exposure-never had hemorrhage of lungs.

Birthplace, Virginia; age, 61 years; height, 5-7; weight, 190 pounds; complexion, mulatto; color of eyes, brown; color of hair, gray; occupation, laborer; permanent marks and scars other than those described below, none

We hereby certify that upon examination we find the following objective conditions:

Pulse rate, 80- 80- 90-; respiration, 20- 20- 26; temperature, N; [Sitting, standing, after exercise.]

Here give a full description of the disabilities, in accordance with Book of instructions, and make a separate paragraph for each disability.

WOUND OF LEFT ARM-There is a scar of 3 inches in circumference located over flexor surface of ulna side of left arm five inches above wrist joint with slight contraction and loss of tissue and represents the point of entrance. The point of exit is represented by a scar of same character located directly opposite over flexor surface. Parts involved skin, fascia and muscle.

Facts within the knowledge of the Board, or any member thereof, relative to the cause of any disability found should be stated.

RHEUMATISM-Soreness and pain over the lumbar muscles-stoops and recovers with apparent difficulty-no atrophy or swelling. All other muscles and joints normal.

DISEASE OF KIDNEYS-Urine clear and amber color-specific gravity 1015-reaction acid-heat and nitric acid show large amount of albumin-no sugar or other abnormal deposits.

DISEASE OF BACK-Described under rheumatism-no other evidence.

DIARRHOEA AND GENERAL DEBILITY-No emaciation or debility-condition of skin, tongue, stomach, liver and spleen normal-hemorrhoidal vessels and rectum normal.

HEMORRHAGE OF LUNGS-No evidence of hemorrhage from lungs-chest at rest 43-full expiration 43-full inspiration 44 1/2). Percussion and auscultation reveal a normal condition of lungs and bronchi.

Whenever a disability is shown or is believed to be due to or aggravated by vicious habits the opinion of the board must be stated. When not due to such habits this fact must be stated.

DISEASE OF EYES-Physical condition of eyes normal-Vision 20/40 DISEASE OF HEART-The heart is normal in size, position and action. Apex beat in 5th left interspace-no dilatation, hypertrophy, dyspnoea, edema or cyanosis.

INJURY OF LEFT ANKLE-There is a bursa over inner side of left ankle joint one inch above internal malleolus of 4 inches in circumference-no lameness.

ASTHMA-No objective evidence of asthma.

No other disability found to exist.

No evidence of vicious habits.

We find that the aggregate permanent disability for earning a support by manual labor is due to G.S.W. of left arm, rheumatism and disease of kidneys, not due to vicious habits, and warrants a rate of \$8 a month.

When rates are recommended solely on subjective evidence the strongest reasons must be given therefor.
