

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

State of Maryland, Baltimore City, to wit:

BE IT REMEMBERED, That on this 11th day of January

A. D. 1909, before me, the subscriber a Justice of the Peace

of the said State, in and for the City aforesaid, personally appeared William Dayricks, age 76 years P. O. Garrison, Baltimore County, Md. In W. O. No 91056 of Elizabeth Dayricks, Widow of Richard Dayricks, late Co. D. 39th U.S.C. Inf.

and made oath in due form of law that I was personally acquainted with the late Richard Dayricks from his childhood, and before he became of marriageable age, know of my own personal knowledge that he was married but one time prior to his marriage to the Claimant, to a Laura Price who died about two years before his marriage to the Claimant and was buried in Piney Grove Cemetery, near Woodensberg Maryland - I knew the Claimant before she became of marriageable age, and do know of my own personal knowledge that she was not married prior to her marriage to the Soldier, whilst I was not present at the marriage, saw them just before and directly after, and frequently visited them after, know they were never divorced, and lived together as man and wife, from date of marriage till the date of his death, after which date the Claimant has not remarried, the Soldier died leaving no child or children under the age of sixteen years by either marriage, I further testify that the Soldier did not serve in the Army or Navy, prior to March 22, 1864, or subsequent to December 4, 1865.
