all these years conversed and met the Claimant almost daily, and saw that during each year he became worse and worse, and would be confined to the bed several weeks suffering with said diseases, constantly taking medicine given him by the Doctors of the Baltimore Free Dispensary of Baltimore City Maryland, and under treatment of Doctors from the Baltimore Free Dispensary as aforesaid, in fact he has no income, and is compelled to go to said Dispensary for medicine and treatment. He has been for years dependent upon his Friends and Charity for support, and Affiants has on several occasions contributed towards the Claimant for his support. That for years the Claimant has been totally unable to perform any manual labor whatever on account of his diseases and disabilities which he has been suffering with from the time he came out of the Army to the present date 1890. He is poor, poverty stricken, has nothing, and cannot get employment anywhere, and on several occasions he secured employment, but on account of his diseases and disabilities he could not perform his duty, and was discharged. Affiant knows these facts from his own personal knowledge observation, conversing and meeting the Claimant almost daily during the years testified herein.
