

month for insurance. He stated also that before the widow's checks arrived she usually borrowed two or three dollars a month from him in cash. It therefore appears that the widow was getting all that could be expected from thirty-eight dollars a month. However, as already stated, I decided to watch and check up on this situation off and on before making any definite recommendation as to the appointment of a committee. The widow objected very much to ^{aguardian} this and under the circumstances it was not seen where anything would be gained but rather that arrangements for a committee would be rather cumbersome, and inconvenient to the widow brought about the complaints of her immoral and irresponsible step relatives. About the time final report would have been made on the case, the widow, as set forth in the foregoing paragraph, died.
