*I have known Charles Seymour*  
*the late husband of this claimant*  
*for over 20 years. He was*  
*married and had one child*  
*when I got acquainted with*  
*him. His wife was named*  
*Jane - He only had one child while*  
*I knew them a little boy that*  
*died before she died -*  
*Jane Seymour died right here*  
*on this block and I saw her*  
*dead body - She died as much*  
*as five or six years before*  
*he married Addie Seymour*  
*this claimant. He never married*  
*after his first wife died till he*  
*married Addie. I know this because*  
*he lived right here in this*  
*street during that period and*  
*I saw him almost daily*  
*He was living here on this street*  
*when he re-married, but Addie*  
*lived on McDonough St - with her sister*  
*within a couple of months or so*  
*they moved from McDonough St back*
