

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION

Supplemental Application for Child Charles Edward Seymour ACT OF JUNE 27, 1890.

To be executed before any officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes in the State, city, or county where said officer resides. If such officer has a seal and uses it upon such paper, no certificate of a county clerk or prothonotary or a clerk of a court shall be necessary; but when no seal is used by the officer before whom the declaration is executed, then a clerk of a court of record or a county or city clerk shall affix his official seal thereto, and shall certify to the signature and official character of said officer.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, SS:

On this 17 day of August, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety four

personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Addie Seymour

aged 36 years, a resident of the 803 Shuter Street, City of Baltimore, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn

according to law, declares that she is the widow of Charles Seymour, who enlisted under the name of Charles Seymour at Baltimore

on the 15 day of July, A. D. 1863, in Co. E. 4th Regt. M.S.C. Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in military service, or vessel, if in the Navy.

and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was honorably discharged May 1866, and died Feb 21 1894. The cause of death need not be stated.

That she was married under the name of Addie Farquhar to said Charles Seymour on the 15th day of December, 1887

by Rev J. R. Allen, at Baltimore Md, there being no legal barrier to said marriage. If there was a former marriage of claimant or her deceased husband, state it here and how dissolved.

That she has not remarried since the death of the said Charles Seymour. Name of soldier or sailor.

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor; that names and dates of birth of all the children now living under sixteen years of age of the soldier are as follows:

Son Charles Edward Seymour born May 20, 1894. that is subsequent to the death of his father, and is subsequent to the filing of her application for Widow's Pension.

That her husband has not been employed in the Military or Naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That she has heretofore applied for pension and the number of her former application is 593082. Be careful to fill this part of the blank correctly.

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, Geo W. Vernon of 313 N Pine Street City of Baltimore

State of Maryland, her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, and to receive therefor a fee of ten dollars; that her post-office address is 803 Shuter Street
