

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

Personally came before me, a Justice of the Peace in and for aforesaid County and State, Martha Johnson, aged 35 years

Post-Office address, well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case, as follows:

That I am intimately well acquainted with the claimant Addie Seymour, knew her and her deceased husband Charles Seymour prior to their marriage, that I was personally present and witnessed their marriage on the 15th December 1887 at the claimant's home, then on McDougall St. between Madison and Ashland Ave Balto. Md. the claimant's name before marriage was Addie Hanton, they were married by the Rev. Mr Allen, a Baptist minister, that I am in intimate association with both claimant and her deceased husband do know and hereby certify that to the best of my knowledge and belief: neither the claimant nor her deceased husband had been previously married. I further swear I do know by my frequent intercourse and visitations that the claimant Addie Seymour has not remarried since the death of her husband Charles Seymour, and that she is entirely dependent upon her own labors for support that she owns no property whatever personal or real except some few articles of furniture in the rooms in which she lives, which is of no value she has no income from any source, that since her husband's death she has been on my poor health confined to her bed for quite awhile and therefore has not been able to earn anything but dependent upon the charity of friends & neighbors. I further declare this affidavit was written in my presence from my statements made to M.D. Hunt and I was not aided by any form or dictation from any source

further declare that I have no interest in said case, and am not concerned in its prosecution.
