I am in receipt of information that Mathias Price, certificate No. 80880, died on September 1, 1926, and in view of this fact, my check No. 2008957-AA for \$72.00 dated September 4, 1926, which was mailed for delivery on date of issue at 1416 East Lexington Street, Baltimore, Maryland, is void for the reason that it covered the period from August 4, 1926, to and including September 3, 1926, and the pensioner was not alive on or after the last day of the period.
