Madam:

Replying to your communication of the 5th instant, reporting the death on September 1, 1926, of your father Mathias Price, certificate No. 80880, I have to advise you as follows:

My check No. 2008957-AA, for \$72.00 dated September 4, 1926, in his favor, is void, for the reason that it covers the period from August 4, 1926, to and including September 3, 1926, and he was not living on or after the last day of this period. Inasmuch as you have received payment thereon it will be necessary for you to reimburse me its full proceeds, \$72.00, either by New York draft, money order or certified personal check, payable to the DISBURSING CLERK, BUREAU OF PENSIONS, and mailed to me in the enclosed penalty envelope which requires no postage.

The refundment of this amount will revert payment in his case to August 4, 1926, and the amount of pension accruing from that date to and including the date of his death, September 1, 1926, may be paid under the provisions of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1895, a copy of which you will find enclosed.

I am also enclosing a World War Act, providing for a further allowance of a sum not to exceed \$100.00 as burial expenses of a veteran of any war. Application for this benefit may be made to the Director, United States Veterans Bureau, Washington, D.C.

An early compliance with my wishes in the matter of this refundment will be appreciated.
