The act of July 3, 1926, provides a pension of \$90 per month in the case of one entitled to Civil War service pension, if he is now, or hereafter, totally helpless or blind. You are now in receipt of \$72 per month for the degree of helplessness or blindness prescribed by the act of May 1, 1920.

If you are totally helpless or blind so as to entitle you to the \$90 rate, immediately notify the Pension Bureau so that your case may be taken up for consideration under this new law. For this purpose you may use the form on the other side of this slip.
