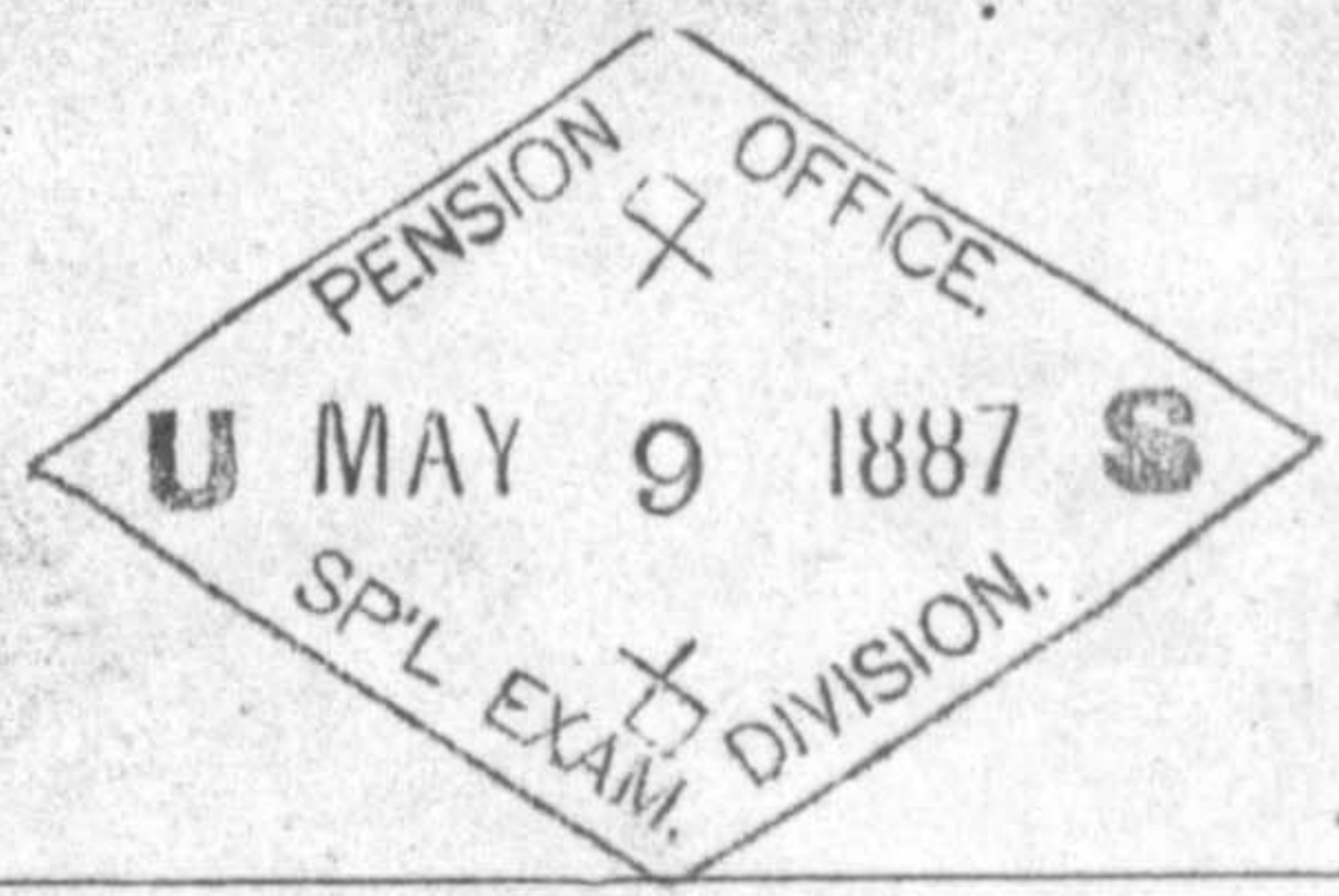
Basis of claim: That soldier died November 7, 1875, of consumption resulting from exposure and colds accompanied with fever, contracted on or about January or February 1864 at or near Berchelt Maryland; also state affiant's means of knowledge of facts testified to. This affiant testifies to being detailed in February or March 1864 with soldiers and others to carry logs and heavy timber for officers quarters and fuel and while so engaged was injured in the spine of the back by a log falling on him causing a general decline.
