I served in the same Regiment with the said Henry Johnson in the War of 1861, having enlisted at Benedict.

I further declare whilst laying at Mc Kim's Hill in Baltimore City Md, we the said Henry Johnson and myself were in the same Hospital together under treatment of Livingston Quick Surgeon in charge

I also declare the said Henry Johnson had contracted a heavy cold which settled on his lungs.

I further declare I next saw the said Henry Johnson after his discharge from the Army on Caroline St in Balto City (about 4 yrs after) when he was in bad health, which he stated to me had continued with him since his discharge from the Army.

I further declare I frequently saw the said Henry Johnson whilst in this City and he was always in bad health and continued to get worse until he died in Nov 1875

I further declare that I have no interest in said case, and I am not concerned in its prosecution.
