 pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 70 years

 Johnson quite well before his
 enlistment in the army. I
 also knew his wife Amelia or Melia
 (Pinkett) I was free born but I saw
 Henry Johnson quite often for many
 years before his enlistment. I saw
 him nearly every week as I lived
 in the same neighborhood with
 him. I never heard of claimant's
 husband being afflicted in any
 way. I never heard that he was
 injured about the back or
 that he had lung trouble.
 I never noticed any cough or
 signs of lung disease or knew
 of his having any trouble with
 his back of any kind before
 his enlistment.

I never saw him after his
 enlistment.
