reside in 4 miles.

I was a private in Co. K. 39th Mass. Inf.
from Mar. 1864 and discharged in
Dec. 1865.

I am now drawing a pension -
I knew Taylor before he enlisted
in the army. We were all boys
and came up together.

I knew him as a somewhat stout
man before he entered the army.

He was disabled while we were at
Bermuda Hundred with some
trouble in his private, I did not
make any examination to see
what the trouble was and I am
sure it was not any bad dis-
order that affected him.

I cannot tell what caused the trouble
but I feel certain it came from
cold. I know he was sick and
made complaints that his private
hurt him and he was off duty but
I did not make an examination
and only know about it from his
complaints. I cannot tell just
when it occurred but it was the
first year we were out.
