I was a private, Corp., and Sgt. — Co. D. 39. U.S.C. Infy.

I have a claim pending for pension.

I knew Taylor before he became a soldier, I did not know then that he was disabled in any manner. He seemed to be hearty & sound.

While in the Army I remember that he had the Mumps, It was about Bermuda Hundred in 1864. Can't tell what month.

I can remember that he complained of having the Rheum, while we were in Va. Think it was about Stottsylvania, Va.

It seems to me that he had it in his back. He walked with a limp, and was stiff while in the Army.

I never made any examination of him, it was just his complaints that I know. I do not remember that he went to the Hospital but I think
