

DEPOSITION K.

Case of James Taylor Ed, No. 887349.

On this 22nd day of July, 1896, at Centreville, County of Queen Anne State of Maryland, before me, M. H. Harrington, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared

Samuel Johnson, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: Age 66. Occupation, Laborer. P.W. and Residence, Centreville, Md.

I was a private in Co. C. 19. Regt. Inf'y for 3 years.

I am drawing a pension. I knew James Taylor before the war and we were together about every Sunday.

He was a second class bodyguard at his enlistment.

I saw him a few times while in the army.

I heard him complain of a pain in one side (Can't tell which one) while in the army; I first heard him complain in Va in - 1864 between Petersburg and Richmond. The pain seemed to be just above one hip.

It was not in his private, he did not make any complaints about his private -

Can't remember that he made any other complaint in the army.

I came home in 1864 and we have both been living here in Centreville ever since and I have seen him almost
