Her residence is 745 Jew Alley Street, City of Baltimore County of Maryland, and her Post-Office address is the same

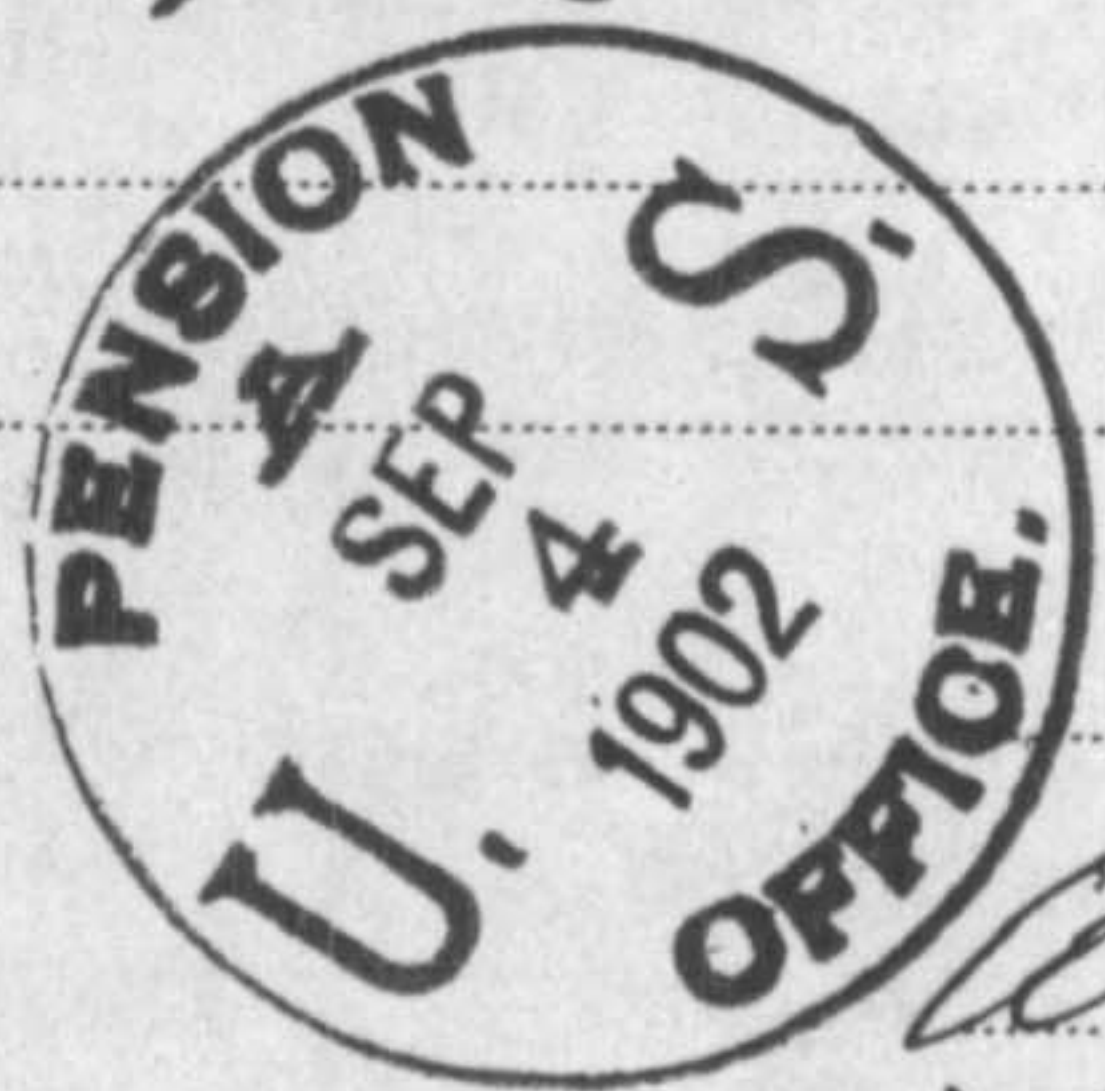
