

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

Act of June 27, 1890.

AS AMENDED BY ACT OF MAY 9th, 1900.

That he make this declaration for the purpose of being on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the

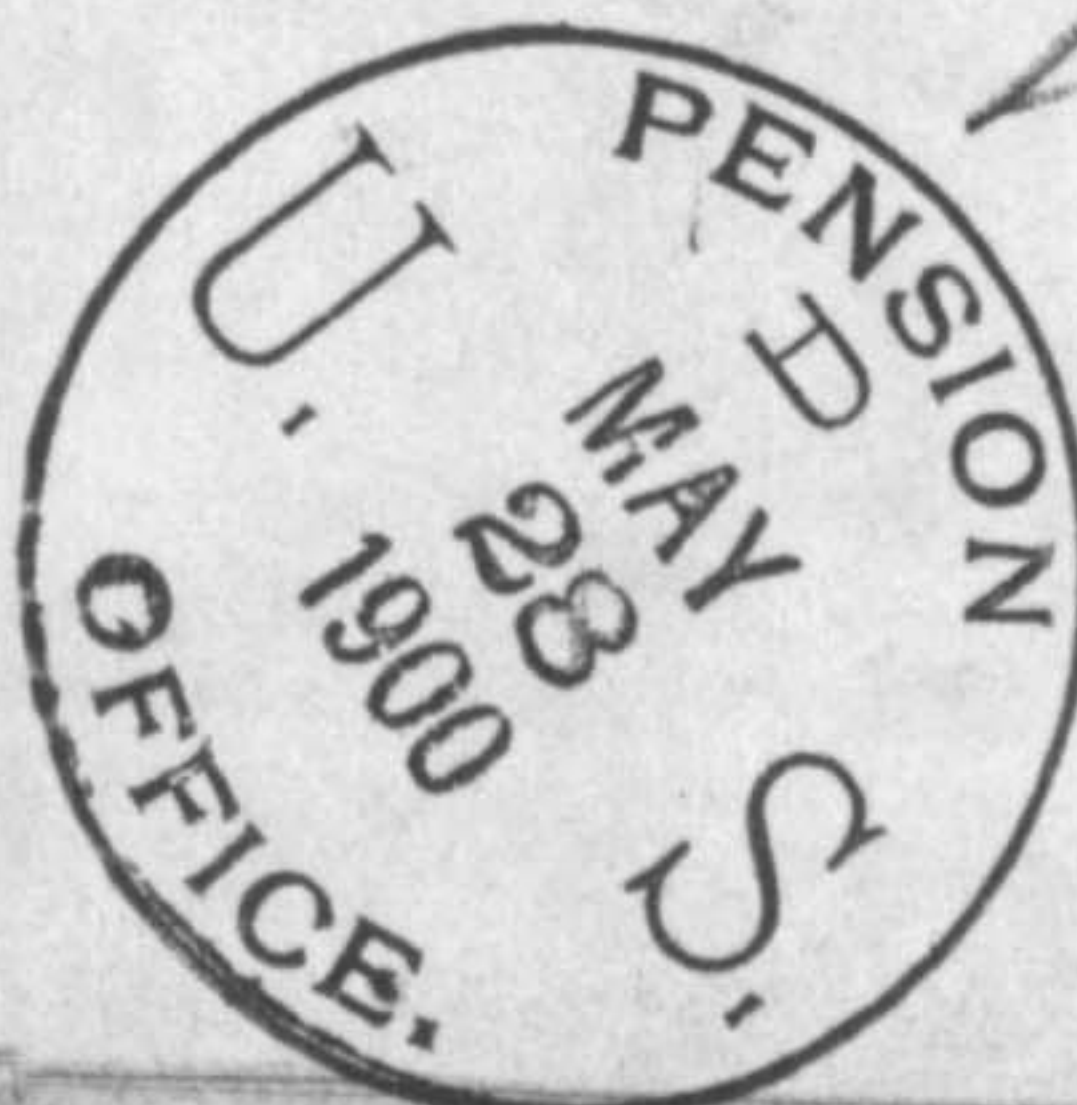
