DEPOSITION

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Case of Jeremiah Hammond No.

On this 2 day of May, 1895, at Bay View Asylum, County of Baltimore State of Maryland, before me, C. A. Kelley, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Dr Charles W. Didenhauer, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: I am 22 years old.

I am resident physician at Bay View Asylum, Baltimore, Md. Jeremiah Hammond has this day been admitted to the Insane Department of the asylum on "admit" of John J. Hoffman, Trustee, based on medical certificates of Dr J. B. Hart, 815 Jefferson Ave., and Dr John Morris, 118 Franklin St. Dr Hart states that his certificate is based upon patient's general condition, while Dr Morris says: "I have no history in this case, but from what I learn from the prison officials, Hammond is suffering from delusions of grandeur. His insanity is of a very mild type." This man was brought here from the Baltimore City jail. I have as yet made no examination whatever of the man.

This statement has been read to me and is correct.
