DEPOSITION A.Case of Jeremiah Hammond, No. _____

On this 2 day of May, 1895, at Bay View Asylum, County of Baltimore State of Maryland, before me, E. A. Harbey, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Charles Warner, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: I am 42 years old.

Jeremiah Hammond came to the jail in February 1895, charged with threatened assault and was released upon giving \$300 security. He acted a little queerly at that time. He came back April 10, charged as before with a threatened assault, an entirely separate offense. He complained of being sick, and Dr Hart was called in. He called Dr Morris in for a consultation, and the result was his being sent to Bay View as an insane patient. He talks a little wild, he imagines that he has a lot of money, and has grand visions. He claims to be a pensioner at \$18 a quarter. He states that he was in Co H, 30 U.S.C., and that his captain's name was Herbert. I would not think him competent at this time to transact any business for himself.
