when she has been since then. She works for Mrs Tom Alexus at ~~all capacity~~ *she gets her board and clothes and spending money from Mrs Alexus. She lived with me in Baltimore prior to July 1914 and was supported by me. The other minors were supported by me before their death. My husband was 69 years old when I married him and sickly and had a dislocated leg. My children were born sickly and a lot of my money went to pay doctors bills. I kept no account in this case. I can't write my name and as more I could not keep accounts and had nobody to assist me. I lost all receipts or vouchers for expenditures on account of the minors. My own rent and doctors bills were paid out of this pension.*
