Sir:

Referring to the claim of Thelma L. Cornish, one of the minors of Joseph Cornish, Co. B, 39th U.S. C. Infantry, Ctf. No. 739,553, you are advised that your complaint against the guardian, Mary E. Cornish, has been investigated, and in view of the evidence adduced, it has been deemed advisable to make no further payments to said guardian.

You are at liberty, if you so desire, to institute proceedings in your local court for the appointment of another guardian, and in the event of such appointment the pension due and to become due, will be paid to such guardian, to be disbursed by him for the sole use and benefit of the minor under the supervision of the court making the appointment. A certificate of the appointment, if made, should be furnished upon the inclosed blank form. Bond should be furnished in the sum of at least \$400.
