
Enclosures. Pension check No. 298703-B for \$687.87, drawn April 10, 1924, to the order of Thelma L. Cornish, whose address is 1225 Ashland Ave., Baltimore, Maryland, and letter of E. E. Miller, Disbursing Clerk, dated April 10, 1924.

Statement. The certificate in this case was issued March 30, 1912, and the amount of the check represents pension due the pensioner as the youngest surviving child named therein to April 7, 1919, the date she attained the age of sixteen years, and for which no claim was made by a guardian during her minority.

Instructions. You will please make delivery of the check in accordance with the direction noted in the Disbursing Clerk's letter, at the earliest possible date. The pensioner should be given all necessary assistance in cashing the check and placing the proceeds to her use through a depository of her own selection within such limits as appear to afford adequate security, and attention should be given as far as necessary to the matter of having trustworthy persons to advise and protect her in its future disposition. She should be cautioned in particular against paying out any part of the pension as fees or compensation to any person for services rendered her in connection with securing its allowance or payment.

The Disbursing Clerk's letter and this should appear as exhibits in your report.
