 34 other manner and he paid his room rent and I forget what
 35 she used to charge him. I believe that I did help Mary Cor-
 36 nish put Jackson out of her house since you suggest it but
 37 my memory is not good like it used to be. I do not recol-
 38 lect Jacksons full name nor what became of him.
 39 I have no financial interest in this pension claim.
 40 I have no idea of the date that Mr Jackson was put out of
 41 the house of Mary Cornish nor how long it was after the
 42 death of Joseph Cornish. I have not been to the house of
 43 Mrs Cornish since it happened, putting Jackson out I mean.
 44 The reason Joe Cornish left Mary Cornish was because he was
 45 old and doting and subject to crazy spells, and it was not
 46 because of any other man sir. I have heard the foregoing
 47 deposition read and it is correct.
