I was employed at a colored hotel in Lafayette street Cape May, it was known as Bryans Villa, as head chambermaid, from June until October and then went to the house of Mrs Stevens. I do not know the christian name of Mr Stevens. I knew Rev Mr Matthews, colored, a pensioner, in Lafeyette street, 637 probably, Cape May, and slept in rooms rented from Matthews and his wife and I boarded my son Herschel with them. Rev Mr Cox, colored, a pensioner, lived with Mr Matthews and he is probably still living in Cape May. I knew no others at Cape may. This is correct as read.
