BE IT REMEMBERED, That on this 29th day of November

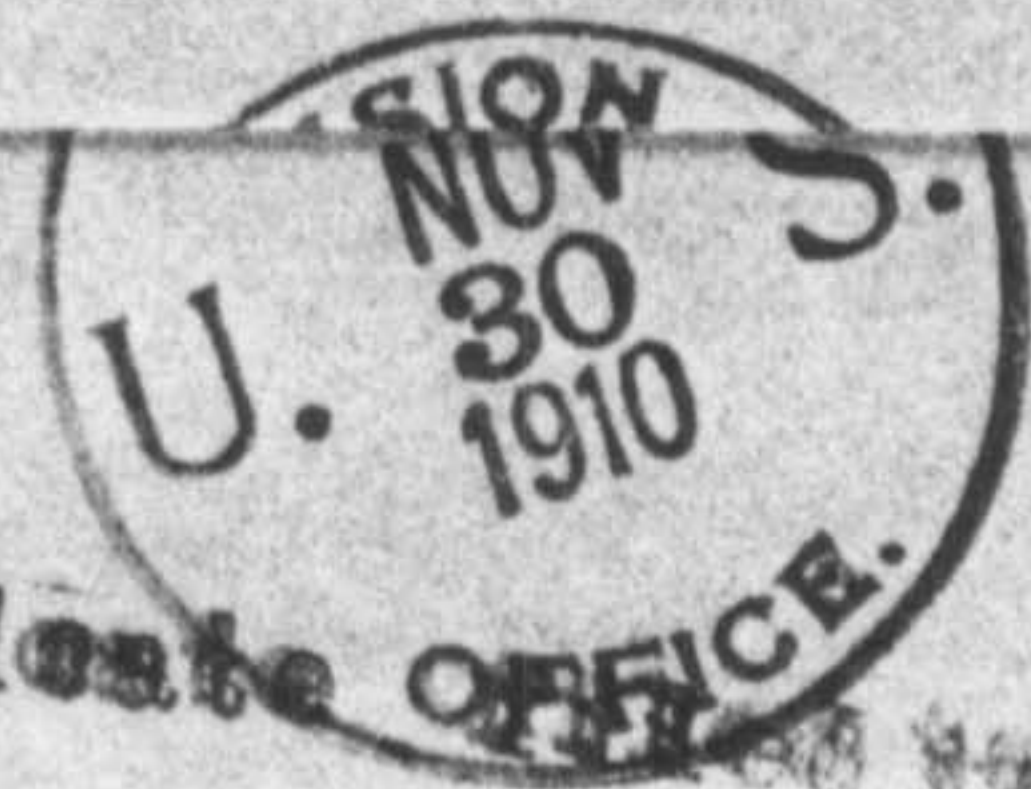
A. D. 1910, before me, the subscriber a Justice of the Peace of the said State, in and for the City aforesaid, personally appeared Mary E. Cornish Wife of Joseph Cornish, late Sgt. Co. B, 39th U.S. Col. Inf. P. O. 425 Druid Hill Ave., Baltimore Md

and made oath in due form of law that I am the lawful wife of the above named Soldier, a woman of good moral character and in necessitous circumstances, through the desertion of my husband, which occurred March 8, 1910, after drawing that quarter's pension, not leaving me one cent, I find him no cause for his action. I was a true wife to him, and bore him in all eight children, one born dead, one a girl married, the six left with me, one a boy in the custody of the School Authorities for non attendance to school, the remaining five in my care and custody.

I further testify that I have not been divorced, or have I made application for a divorce, I am unable to earn a support for myself and children, by reason of infirmities have been under medical treatment since November 1909, I have not, neither am I at this date, and since of any institution, have resided with my children from the date of desertion to the present time, I had not been previously married my husband had
