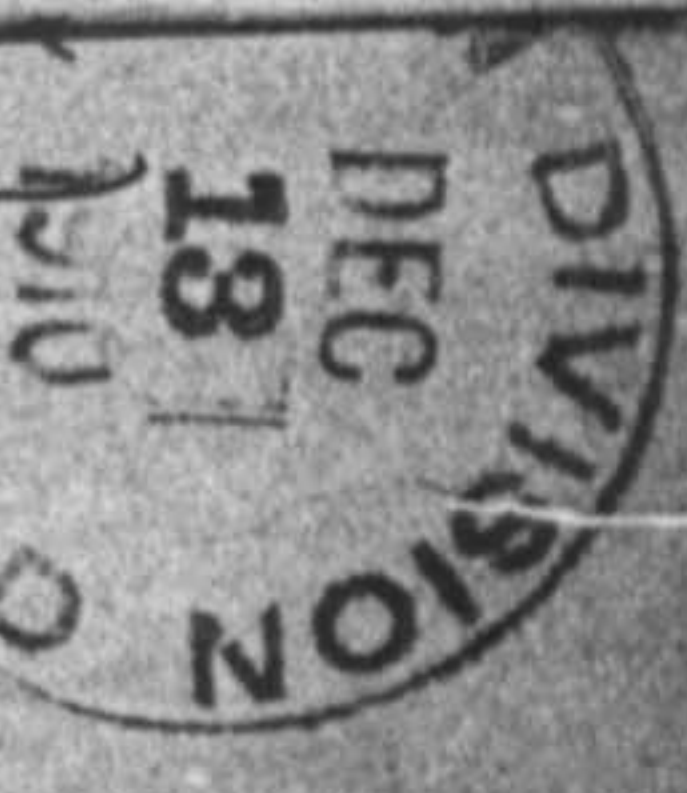
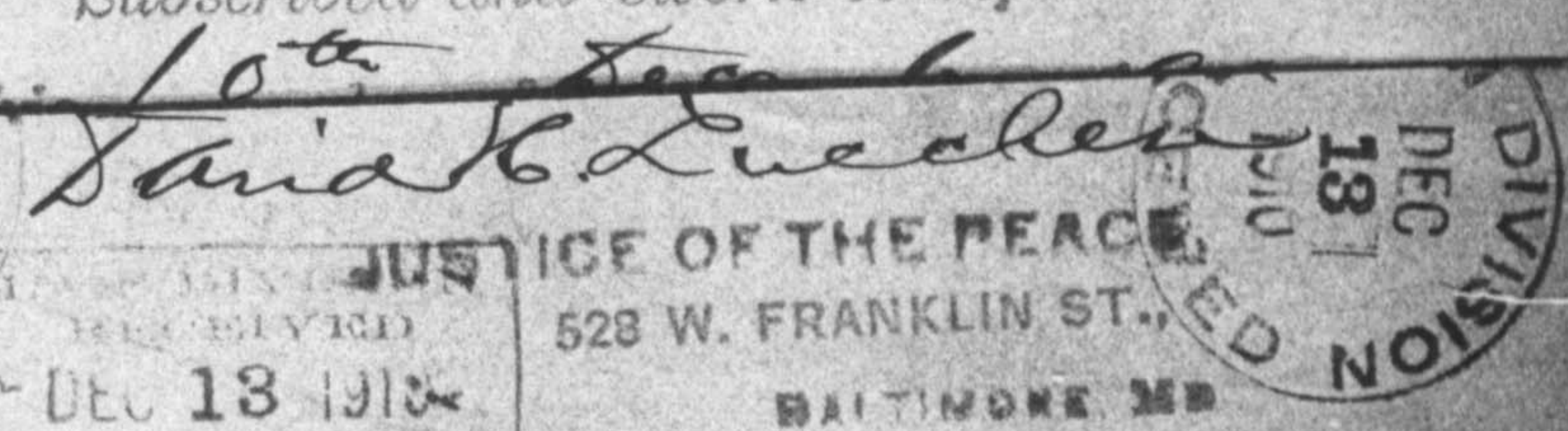
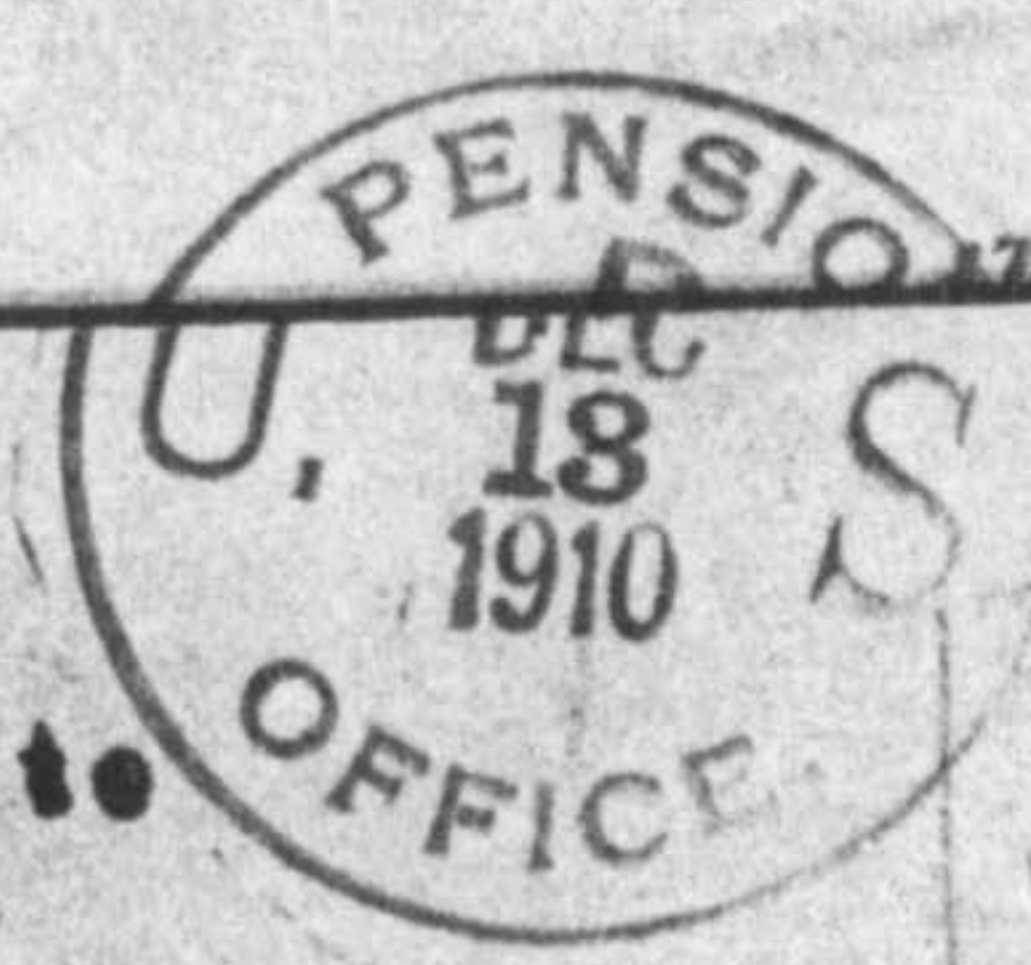
A. D. 1910, before me, the subscriber a Justice of the Peace Sarah A. Buchanan,

I left there about October of that year, they were living together as husband and wife, I continued to visit his wife and about March of this year, I called on him to learn what had become of some things I left in the house, he told me I would find them there, as he had left his wife. I was not surprised as he would swear at his wife and children. And declare he would leave. I am sure from my intimate acquaintance with the Claimant she is a woman of good moral character, for him no cause or provocation, as she was most industrious, working night and day, after working out during the day, would work and iron for white people this to aid in support of herself and children. She has no means, owns no property of any description, except some old furniture. She is in necessitous circumstances. She has not been able to work since last June, I am a frequent visitor and know the story from my own personal knowledge. I further testify that I have no interest in the claim.
