of the said State, in and for the City aforesaid, personally appeared Wm. H. D. Wilson,

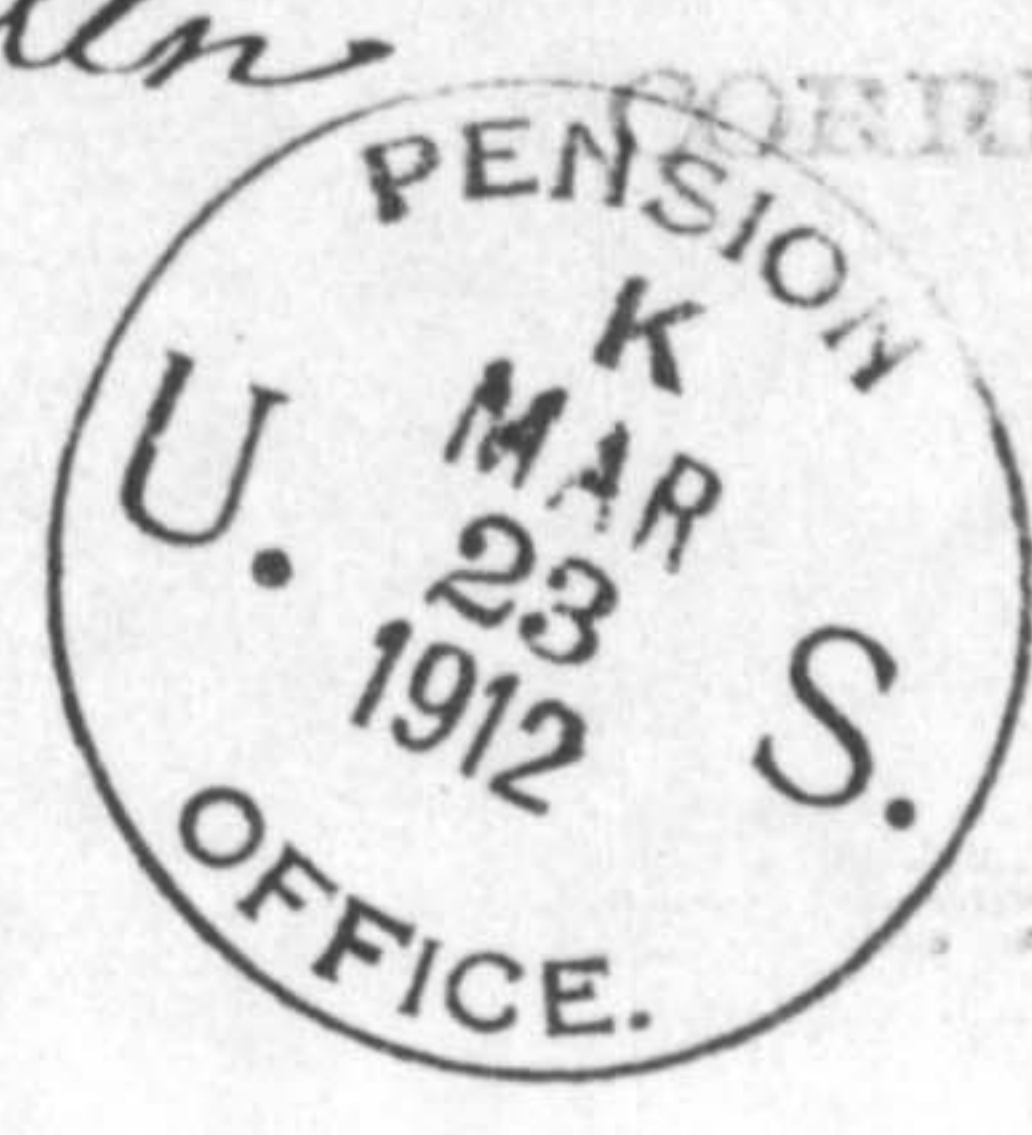
