Gen. Minors of Joseph Cornish, late Co B, 39<sup>th</sup> Regt. M.S.C. Vol. Inf.

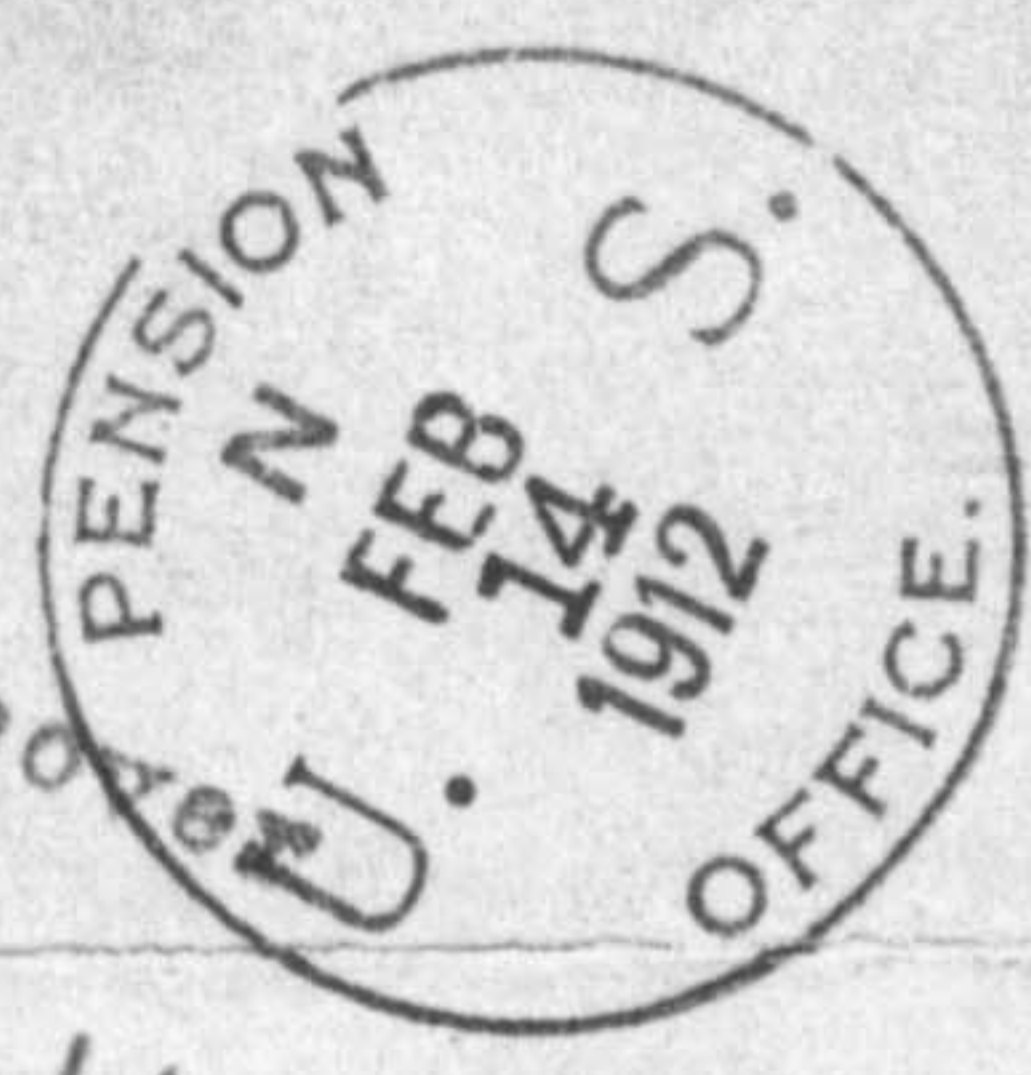
and made oath in due form of law that I am well and personally
