# GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

That he was a comrad with Thomas Carter Co B 30th U.S.C. Troops all through their service and he knowing he contracted Rheumatism and disease of the eyes during the early spring and summer of 1864 in the campaign from Manassa to Deepbottom and on to Petersburg Va, when he became so bad they sent him away to some Hospital
