SIR:

I have the honor to request that you will furnish from the records of the War Department a full report as to the service, disability, and hospital treatment of Benjamin Adams, who, it is claimed, enlisted June 16, 1864, and served as Private in Co. "C", 30th Regt. U.S.C.T.; also in Co.

and was discharged at Alexandria Va., Sept. 2, 1865. While serving in Co. "C", 30th Regt. U.S.C.T. he was disabled by rheumatism and general debility, contracted at Petersburg Va. July 30, 1864.

and was treated in hospitals of which the names, locations, and dates of treatment are as follows: Treated in Field Hosp't. then at City Point, then at Summit Hosp't. Philadelphia, then at Camp Distribution, Alexandria Va. then at Baptist Church, Alexandria, then at Gray's Church, same place, then at Lovintine Hosp't. same place and discharged. A full military history of soldier is desired and a full report of all Hosp't. treatment received by him, as shown by all records in your office, should be furnished. (See accompanying report.)
