WR hereby certify That WR have carefully examined this applicant, who claims that while in the service of the United States, at or near a place named _____, and while in line of duty,

Cause of disability and the degree. on or about the _____ day of _____, 1861st, he incurred Hernia on either or both sides, and that in consequence thereof he is _____ disabled for earning his subsistence by manual labor.

Particular description. He states that he is 49 years of age, that he weighs 157 pounds, and that he is 5 feet 9 inches in height. His pulse-rate per minute is 78, his respiration 17, and his temperature normal

Give the rational and physical signs so fully that how and why and how much the claimant is disabled shall clearly appear. When there are neither structural changes nor physical nor rational signs in support of the claim, that fact should be stated. Thereafter should be made in compliance with the "Instructions."

The examination reveals the following facts:

WR think we have examined the applicant with sufficient care to settle the question as per order by slip, for after summing him before the Board we required him to go for three days without his truss, and at the expiration of that time we made a prolonged and careful examination by each member of the Board and we are unable to find any hernia on either side. The left abdominal ring is somewhat patulous, the Spermatic is at work regularly, we know nothing of Dr. Herman who had an office with Mr. Thaler No 134 N. Euter St. Baltimore by whom applicant says he was treated but we do know favorably, Dr. S. S. Keller who now treats applicant but not for hernia

From the condition and history of the claimant, it is our opinion the disability was _____ incurred in the service as claimed, and that it is not aggravated or protracted by vicious habits.

WR find the disability as above described to entitle him to no rating.

SEC. 4. Act July 25, 1882. "That all examinations shall be thorough and searching, and the certificate contain a full description of the physical condition of the claimant at the time, which shall include all the physical and rational signs and a statement of all structural changes. The fee for such examination and satisfactory certificate therefor, shall be two dollars, &c., &c. No certificate will be considered satisfactory, or such examination paid for, unless the above requirements of the law are satisfied."
