

Examining Surgeon's Certificate.

Baltimore April 1863

Applicant's service.

I hereby Certify, That I have carefully examined Shadrach Boulden, late a private in Co C of U.S. C Troops 9th Regt in the service of the United States, who was discharged at Baltimore, on the day of July, 1864, and is an applicant for an invalid pension, by reason of alleged disability resulting from los of sight.

Degree of disability.

In my opinion the said Shadrach Boulden is Totally incapacitated for obtaining his subsistence by manual labor from the cause above stated.

Origin.

Judging from his present condition, and from the evidence before me, it is my belief that the said disability was caused in the service aforesaid in the line of duty.

Probable duration.

The disability is permanent.

Shadrach Boulden state that his sight was very good previous to joining the Army, he attributes the loss of his sight to a severe and protracted pain in his head caused he thinks by a severe cold which he says he thinks was caused by sleeping with wet clothes on, Guth, Kasper all of which occurred near Dorchester Md
