Discharged for total opacity of both cornea,
producing total blindness resulting from an
attack of purulent ophthalmia contracted
while in the service

His Capt certifies he was sent to Hospt. for
blindness and that at enlistment he was perfectly
sound

General of his comrades certify that in Jan.
1864 he was taken to Hospt. and soon lost the use of his eyes
such an extent that he was unable to do any
after being in Hospt about a week he lost the
use of his eyes & became totally blind & has been
so ever since

Feb. 26, 68, Dr Owings stated him total loss of
sight Total blindness from inflammation of tissues of both eyes
resulting in disorganization Careful general examination shows no reason to suspect
venereal origin

Admitted Mar 11, 1868, to a Pension of \$25 per month, commencing

Disability July 28, 1864 total

Disabled by total blindness
