

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

Personally came before me, a Justice of the Peace in and for aforesaid County

being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case, as follows:

That he has been personally acquainted with the claimant Mary F. Boulden for the past ten years. That he was personally acquainted with her deceased husband Shadrack Boulden all of his life.

That he was personally present at the marriage of the said Shadrack Boulden and Mary F. Boulden formerly Mary F. Anderson, who were married at Baltimore Maryland by the Rev. Wm. Allen on the 15th day of March 1883; That they continued to live together as man and wife and were so recognized by the community in which they lived from the date of the marriage as aforesaid up to the date of said Shadrack Boulden's death, which took place at Balts. Md. May 9th 1891, and that the claimant has not remarried since the death of said husband Shadrack Boulden.

The Deponent was also acquainted with the first wife of Shadrack Boulden, Jenny Boulden, who died at Baltimore Maryland about December 10th 1875 that he recollects distinctly the fact of her death and viewed the dead body.
