I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. _____, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office. In reply to your inquiry of January 16, 1868.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Abner M. Doswell was enrolled on the 17th day of Dec., 1863, at Dorchester Md in Co. "C", 19th Regiment of U. S. C. Troop Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 25th day of Dec. 1863, at Camp Stanton, near Annapolis Md in Co. "C", 19th Regiment of U. S. C. T. Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "C" of that Regiment, for the months of from December 25th 1863, he is reported to November & December 1864. he is reported "Present." On Muster-out Roll of said Co. & Regt. dated Brownsville, Texas, January 15th 1867, he is reported "Present." Mustered-out with Company.
