On the Muster Roll of Co. "H" of that Regiment, for the months of March & April 1864, he is reported "Sick in Drill Hospital, Sall's, Md. Since February 3, 1864" & so reported on Rolls for May & June & July & Augt. 1864. On Roll for Sept & Oct 1864; he is reported "Discharged Sept. 30 1864 for disability by order of Major General Wallace &c."
