I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. \_\_\_\_\_, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office. In reply to your inquiry of January 16, 1868.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Benjamin Curtis was enrolled on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1864, at St. Mary's Md in Co. "A", 19<sup>th</sup> Regiment of U. S. C. T. Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1864, at Smidlet Md., in Co. "I", 19<sup>th</sup> Regiment of U. S. C. T. Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "I" of that Regiment, for the months of March & April 1864, he is reported "Wounded in Shunandeah Valley in Hosp't. Balto April 16, 1864."

and so reported on rolls for May & June, July & Augt. & Sept. & Oct. 64. on rolls for Nov & Dec. 64 "Present" on rolls for Jan & Feb 65. "Sick in Hosp't since Jan'y 27, 65 &c." on rolls for Mar & April 65 "Present" on rolls from May & June 65 to Nov & Dec. 1866. "Present" on Muster-out Roll of said Co. & Regt. dated Providence Texaz, January 15, 1867. he is reported "Present" Mustered out, sixth Company. (A Corporal)
