growing on my leg. I have never served
in the *U.S. Army or Marine Corps.* and never
in the army but the one period in *C. A. 4th*

and have lived in *Baltimore* since I was a
year old. I was free born but was bound
out until I enlisted. I was just under 17
years old when I enlisted.
