

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

We have been intimately and personally acquainted with Henrietta Grandison, and her family for 35 years and 20 years respectively and do know of our own personal knowledge that the said Henrietta Grandison, owns no property and has no income but what she earns from her daily labor by washing, ironing and house cleaning. With the aid of friends she was compelled to support her deceased husband in the last few years on account of his disabilities, and she is wholly dependent upon her own labors.

We further swear that the said Henrietta Grandison, has not remarried since the death of her deceased husband Charles Grandison, had such been the facts we would have known it, from our intercourse and associations and that the deceased soldier left no children under 16 years of age by the claimant or by any previous marriage.

We further declare that we have no interest in said case, and are not concerned in its prosecution.
