Guardian of Minor Children for Pension,
UNDER ACT OF JULY 25, 1866.

in the County and State aforesaid, who, being duly sworn according to law, doth on oath make the following declaration, as Guardian of the minor child John H. Brogden

deceased, in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the second section of the act of Congress approved July 25, 1866, increasing pensions to widows and orphans. She further declares that he is the Guardian

of (3) James Henry Brogden, Elisha Brogden, & Mary Jane Brogden

whose father was a Private in Company I 39th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops

in the war of 1861, and that the said John H. Brogden died at Petersburg Va

on the 30th day of July A. D. 1867 (4) in consequence of

Wounds received in action before Petersburg Va. from which he died upon the field

that the mother of the child de aforesaid (5) was remarried

and that the date of birth of said ward s is as follows:

James Henry Brogden ^{born} aged August 12th 1850 Elisha Brogden born
July 6th 1853 and Mary Jane Brogden born September 23rd 1850

She further declares that the parents of the said ward s were married at Baltimore City
 in the County of Baltimore, and State of Maryland, on the
3^d day of May 1849, by Rev. John Jordan
 and that the maiden name of the mother was Henrietta Jones
